

John S. (Scotty) Donaldson

John Donaldson affectionately called Scotty by his associates and friends was born in Scotland and migrated to Quebec City at age 12 where he received his high school education.

Graduating from UNB in 1937 with a BScF he held various positions with Anglo Canadian Pulp and Paper, Abitibi and St. Lawrence Corporation over a span of nine years.

In 1946 John moved to the Maritimes as Woodlands Manager at Sheet Harbor, Nova Scotia becoming Vice President and General Manager in 1956. He moved to the Miramichi in 1966 as Vice President and General Manager of Acadia Pulp and Paper Company Ltd. In 1972 he became Vice President and General Manager of Airscrew Weyrock until he retired in 1978 only to un-retire in 1980 to accept a position with Boise Cascade in Labor Relations, and again retiring in 1983.

A life member of ARPFNS, former president of NBFPA he has been active over the years and is still active on the Miramichi in promoting forestry recognition through tourism and development of resources.

One of the most widely known forestry personalities in Eastern Canada he has made outstanding contributions to the forest industry and community he has lived in. Scotty Donaldson is widely known and respected in forestry and labor relations circles and has influence not only the Miramichi area but the whole of New Brunswick.
